





Snow Ordinance Reminder



Boone adopted a Snow ordinance that will be put into effect in anticipation of major snow events. When the Snow Ordinance goes into effect all vehicles and trailers must be removed from city streets. The result is a street that can now be completely cleaned from curb-to-curb for safe travel of vehicles.

To make this a success we NEED YOUR HELP. We need citizens to spread the word. During snow falls we need citizens to remove all vehicles from city streets. Citizens can monitor the city website at www.boonegov.com and tune to KWBG AM 1590 to determine when the Snow Ordinance is in effect. With your help we can make this year another successful year for snow removal. The Mayor and Council have a desire to keep citizens informed when the snow ordinance will go into effect. IF you would like to be contacted (via e-mail or cell phone text message) each time the snow ordinance goes into effect you will need to provide the city with an e-mail address or your cell phone number and cellular service provider. You can e-mail this information to: clerk@city.boone.ia.us. The city will send out a notification message noting when the ordinance goes into effect. We will also send a note when the ordinance ends. To register you will need a copy of your bill.

Shop With A Cop

December 5th "Shop with a Cop" will be in its 11th year. The Downtown streets of Boone will be filled with children kindergarten thru sixth grades. They will shop with officers and volunteers for basic necessities and Christmas gifts for their families. Each child will have \$100 to spend. These children are nominated by school teachers, administrators and social workers. Nomination forms are available at the police department, in Boone Schools and at the former Iowa Department of Human Services building on West Mamie Eisenhower Ave. Forms must be submitted to Shop With A Cop by Thanksgiving. Criteria for being chosen are that the children are in the Boone Community School District and grades K-6th. Donations are always welcome and can be dropped off in piggy banks located in stores throughout the city or deposited in the "Shop With A Cop" account at either Vision Bank location in Boone.
