STATEMENT OF COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

July 3, 2023 6:00 p.m.

The City Council of Boone, Iowa, met in regular session in the City Hall Council Chambers on July 3, 2023, at 6:00 p.m. with Mayor Slight presiding. The meeting was also available via Zoom. The following Council Members were present: Byrd, Henson, Stines, Moorman, Williamson, and Angstrom. Via Zoom: Hilsabeck. Absent: none.

Moorman moved; Williamson seconded to approve the agenda as presented. Ayes: Henson, Stines, Moorman, Hilsabeck, Williamson, Angstrom, and Byrd. Nays: none.

Mayor Slight swore in Police Officer Alexis Clark.

Stines moved; Byrd seconded to approve Resolution 3119 determining the necessity and fixing a date for a public hearing at 6:00 p.m. on August 21, 2023 for the consideration to adopt the proposed Southwest Multi-Family Residential Urban Revitalization Plan. Ayes: Stines, Moorman, Hilsabeck, Williamson, Angstrom, Byrd, and Henson. Nays: none.

Moorman moved; Williamson seconded to set a public hearing for July 17, 2023 at 6:00 p.m. for the consideration of the rezoning of parcel(s) legally described as Lot 7 NW SE; Lot 2 SW SE (EX BLDG SITE) & N 348' Lot 4 SW SE, from R-1, Single Family Residential, to R-3, Multi-Family Residential. Ayes: Moorman, Hilsabeck, Williamson, Angstrom, Byrd, Henson, and Stines. Nays: none.

Williamson moved; Stines seconded to approve the Boone County Chamber's Adopt-A-Street Litter Removal Program Application for Story Street from 6th Street to 9th Street, including 7th Street from Allen to Keeler, and 8th Street from Allen to Keeler. Ayes: Hilsabeck, Williamson, Angstrom, Byrd, Henson, Stines, and Moorman. Nays: none.

Ades reported on three (3) options that he found Cities utilizing regarding vacant buildings: 1) Treat as a Nuisance Abatement under our current ordinances and procedures (common practice and typically how Boone handles vacant buildings). 2) Registration of neglected vacant buildings. 3) Registration of all vacant buildings. The Council discussed their concerns, but no decision was made.

Andrews reported that the 1st Street and Delaware stop sign has been installed and several notices were put out notifying the public.

Williamson moved; Stines seconded to approve a five (5) day Alcohol License to the Boone County Chamber for Pufferbilly Days. Ayes: Williamson, Angstrom, Byrd, Henson, Stines, Moorman, and Hilsabeck. Nays: none.

Chief Adams informed the Council that demolition has started for the Fire Station Remodel Project.

Skare stated that one (1) nomination was received for the Community Dedication Award; Gary Irvin nominated Mayor Slight. Moorman moved; Stines seconded to award the Community Dedication Award to Mayor John Slight. Ayes: Angstrom, Byrd, Henson, Stines, Moorman, Hilsabeck, and Williamson. Nays: none.

Skare proposed three (3) projects to use the \$20,000.00 Boone County American Rescue Plan Grant Funds on. Kevin Pearson, Park Commissioner, addressed the Council requesting any remaining funds to go towards the Park's open-air shelters for roof repairs. Angstrom moved; Henson seconded to submit the request for the \$20,000.00 Grant from Boone County for the following projects: 1) Roof repairs on the Park's open-air shelters \$9,130.00. 2) Garage door openers quantity two (2) for Public Works \$3,370.00. 3) Fire hydrant replacement outside the Fire Station \$7,500.00. Ayes: Byrd, Henson, Stines, Moorman, Hilsabeck, Williamson, and Angstrom. Nays: none.

Skare updated the Council on several Fiscal Year 2023 goals: Four (4) demolitions were completed and six (6) more are pending, 477 nuisance abatements including snow removal and mowing have been handled. City Zoning Ordinance has been reviewed by

Mid-Iowa Planning Alliance (MIPA), staff will be bring their recommendations to the Planning and Administration Committee. City of Boone has ran commercials throughout the 2022 and 2023 summers; advertisements have been placed in the Convention and Visitors Bureau Magazine and Livability Magazine; and upcoming we will have Pufferbilly Day media coverage on Today in Iowa. The new sidewalk program has been implemented but no applications have been received. Stines requested that The Concept Works, Inc. do an article on the sidewalk program. Council discussed a Fiscal Year 2024 goal for utilizing the land by Family Resource Center for soccer fields; after discussion Stines requested Staff to contact the Middle School regarding the utilization of their land for soccer fields.

Skare presented a proposal from Short Elliott Hendrickson for the engineering cost to do a study of the downtown parking along Story Street from 6th Street to 11th Street in the amount of \$9,000.00 plus expenses. The study would include the analysis, feasibility and associated impacts with angled parking. Angstrom moved; Henson seconded to discontinue any further research into the downtown parking changes. Ayes: Henson, Stines, Moorman, Hilsabeck, Williamson, Angstrom, and Byrd. Nays: none.

Skare stated the South Marion and West Park project would start July 10th due to a supply issue.

Mayor Slight asked if there were any questions or items to be removed from the Consent Agenda; no requests were made.

Moorman moved; Byrd seconded to approve the following items on the Consent Agenda: 1) Minutes of previous meetings. 2) Bills payable. 3) Alcohol License Renewal for Toby K's Hideaway. 4) Alcohol License Renewal for Colorado Grill. 5) Alcohol License Renewal for MJ's Venue. 6) Resolution 3120 approving the hiring of a new full-time Police Officer, Alexis Clark, to fill a vacant position for the Boone Police Department with a wage of \$4,781.58 per month. 7) Resolution 3121 authorizing the disposal of personal City property from the Water Treatment Plant and Wastewater Plant. Ayes: Stines, Moorman, Hilsabeck, Williamson, Angstrom, Byrd, and Henson. Nays: none.

Williamson moved; Byrd seconded to approve the first reading of Ordinance 2291 to allow the City of Boone, Iowa to set fees for meter testing by Resolution, amending Chapter 91, Section 91.09. Ayes: Byrd, Henson, Stines, Moorman, Hilsabeck, Williamson, and Angstrom. Nays: none.
