### 2. Describe your mission and programs/services provided?

The purpose of this organization is to provide a source of entertainment and involvement in theatre activities in the Boone area. We produce four mainstage shows each year as well as hosting Open Mic Nights and other special events. We provide educational opportunities for area youth during the summer months through weekly workshops. We also host two summer camps for youth that culminate in a performance.

# 3. To what particular use(s) will any City funds directed to this individual/organization be put?

The funds will be used to purchase historically appropriate costumes to be utilized during the production of a show set in the Victorian Era. We have a limited inventory of costumes that meet the needs of a show set during this time period. Dear Boone Arts Advisory Board Members,

I am Sonia Heins, the STEAM Teacher at Ledges Elementary. I became aware of your grant program when invited to apply by Courtney Sisson, board member and parent of a Ledges student. While a veteran early childhood teacher, I am new to Boone, and could not have imagined a better match. Ledges is truly an amazing place, and Boone should be very proud of its newest school.

The STEAM program is an extension of STEM learning- Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math, now incorporating Art. Young children need hands-on, real-world learning opportunities. Ledges Elementary was specifically built for early learning, promotes creativity, and hosts an amazing faculty, staff, and administration. I am working to build a curriculum incorporating age-appropriate, challenging, meaningful learning experiences.

Courtney's timing was wonderful. I had been admiring an upright classroom loom, a large-scale structure on which children can weave. Weaving and textiles are a relatable, interesting media. Designing and planning, counting, creating patterns, noticing texture and fine motor dexterity are just a few skills which will be reinforced using the loom. Communication, collaboration, and care will be important, as will respecting the work of peers. Patience while our textiles are in progress, and watching an intricate process from beginning to end will be very rewarding. I imagine some works will be used on display in our beautiful new building. Other ideas include auction items for fundraising, donations and gifts, and possibly utilitarian textiles like mats or rugs.

Receiving a grant from your council will fully fund this new adventure in learning! Most students are not familiar with weaving, and have likely never seen nor used a loom. I am excited to introduce a new media and all its potential to our youngest students in Boone Schools.

Shops on Story is a group made up of downtown business owners that advocate to help create a better downtown for our community. We do that by helping to boost and encourage business between one another as well as put on community events that pull people to our downtown area. Each and every one of our businesses is invested with time, money, sweat and tears to boost our community and bring different retail and service options to our local community members.

We are located in a variety of addresses down Story and Keeler St, as well as 7th and 8th St. Most of our mission involves simply bringing awareness to what your downtown has to offer, while also trying to create a well maintained area that is pleasant to the eye. We work with all kinds of different local entities to help boost our downtown any way we can!

Shops on Story runs 5 downtown events: Sweets on Story in February, Summer on Story in May, Sips on Story in September, Spooky Story St & Murder on Story in October, and Santa on Story in December. We also work with Chamber and Visit Boone County events, try to boost the VFW and Legion, while promoting as many community groups as we can. We sincerely believe that unity is one of the major steps in creating a better Boone.

Shops on Story is requesting this grant in the amount of \$500 to run our Summer on Story event. Summer on Story is an artist based event in which we bring in local artists to busk (actively create their art in the street and receive tips), sell their art and perform. We encourage every form of art of participate from knitting to painting, henna to music, dance to story time! We believe art can come from all walks of life but every artist shares one trait...the love of what they do. Because we so greatly believe in supporting those following their dreams our downtown businesses fund this completely themselves. For the past two years this has cost the Shops on Story businesses around \$1000.

We rent the green space which costs \$375 for the space and 10 tables, then we ask for donations to go to a free community lunch. The food is provided through donations from sponsors but in the end it is the Shops businesses that cover anything not provided, the past two years that has been a \$200 difference. The VFW then cooks the meal and receives financial donations for their time. We also incur around \$100 (\$87 in 2023) for printing cost and getting posters up around the town. We also spent \$200 on radio advertisement and another \$100 on a facebook boost. Each business also contributes an activity for kids which costs each business, such as bubbles, sidewalk chalk, dancing ribbons, hula hoops and more! In the end this event costs us just under \$1000 split between the businesses that can offer financial contributions. This is getting bigger and better every year and we know we can make it so much more with the contribution of a grant from our local Arts Board.

Money isn't the only donation made during this event! Each business owner also gives an enormous amount of time. From design, marketing, advertising to literally physically moving tables and street barriers each business owner depends on their strengths to promote this event and to create something amazing together.

We couldn't ask for a better team! Each of us is grateful for the impact or events have had on our downtown. We are constantly hearing, 'We didn't even know you were here!' From community members that have lived here their whole lives. We are excited to offer this, and each of our events, annually to continue to bring awareness to our beautiful downtown and its amazing business owners.

Our goal is to bring Boone together, through unity, in our downtown. We can't wait for the Arts Advisory Board to join us on this mission!
