## STATEMENT OF COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

August 20, 2018 6:00 p.m.

The City Council of Boone, Iowa, met in regular session in the City Hall Council Chambers on August 20, 2018, at 6:00 p.m. with Mayor Slight presiding. The following Council Members were present: Byrd, McGinn, Stines, Hicks, Piklapp, and Ray. Absent: Stecker.

Hicks moved; Byrd seconded to approve the agenda as presented. Ayes: McGinn, Stines, Hicks, Piklapp, Ray, and Byrd. Nays: none.

Terri Jensen, from the Green Space Coalition, presented a request to use the green space at 8<sup>th</sup> Street and Story Street on September 1<sup>st</sup> from 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. for a fundraiser with a barbeque and a DJ. Stines moved; Hicks seconded to approve the Green Space Coalition's request to use the green space on September 1<sup>st</sup> from 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Ayes: Stines, Hicks, Piklapp, Ray, Byrd and McGinn. Nays: none.

Susan Herrick, President of the Boone Community Theatre, presented to the Council the history of the Theatre; and stated that their current building, formerly the Garfield School, needs \$60,000.00 of repairs done to become compliant with the fire and building codes. Herrick stated that their current building is the perfect "playhouse space"; they have considered numerous buildings around town and have not found one that suits their needs. Herrick presented the Theatre Group's minimum building requirements that they are looking for. Lori Hay, Vice President of the Boone Community Theatre, presented four (4) alternative options to the one that the City initially proposed.

Council discussed the cost of demolishing the buildings, concerns of liability if that building is occupied, rezoning of the property so that the theatre could possibly develop the land, possible incentives if they are able to find a building, and a bond to build a community building with a designated area for the Theatre. Linda Blakely, introduced herself as a professional with 40 years of experience in Talent Theatre and Community Theatre all around Iowa, she explained the business side of "show business". Blakely addressed the value of the current theatre building, the deteriorating conditions, and lack of occupancy per performance. Blakley recognized the Mayor and Council's recognition of how important the performance arts can be for the community and that it is not the City Government's position to support any non-profit organization with tax payer dollars. Blakley then addressed the Boone Theatre Group and recommended that they accept the initial offer from the City.

Ray moved to continue with the initial offer; seconded by Hicks. Piklapp requested the item to be tabled until early September, so he had time to do further research on the information that was just provided. Robbins objected, stating that we have been dealing with this for nine (9) months and we have a building that is non-compliant with the laws of this City, we have some tremendous liability issues, it is not in compliance with the zoning laws, and it is not in compliant with the ADA rules. Robbins clarified that not only should the Theatre Group not hold performances in this building but they should not be practicing there either, nor should anyone be occupying the building until it is brought into compliance. Ray withdrew his motion.

Ray moved, to make effective immediately that the property will no longer be able to be used for practice or performances, to direct staff to post a notice that the building is non-inhabitable, and to table further decisions until September's meeting; seconded by Piklapp. Ayes: Hicks, Piklapp, Ray, Byrd, McGinn and Stines. Nays: none.

Ray moved; Piklapp seconded to set a public hearing for September 4, 2018 at 6:00 p.m. to consider the sale of 332 W. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, Boone, Iowa. Ayes: Piklapp, Ray, Byrd, McGinn, Stines and Hicks. Nays: none.

Piklapp advised the Economic Development Committee reviewed a Boone Downtown Incentive Fund (BDIF) application submitted by Cyclone Car Credit at 304 Mamie Eisenhower; the initial walk-through will be August 23, 2018 at 11:00 a.m.

Skare stated that a proposed Purchase Agreement from Destiny Homes regarding 332 W. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, Boone, Iowa was in the packet for the Council's review. If there are no objections, a formal agreement will be in the Consent Agenda for Council's approval at the September 4<sup>th</sup> Council meeting after the public hearing has been held.

Rouse announced that Waylon Andrews has accepted the Daily Operations Manager position; there is a resolution under the Consent Agenda for the Council's approval for his salary and benefits.

Scott confirmed with the Council that they have an agreement with Simmering-Cory to write two (2) grants and to conduct a door-to-door community survey for the Park Avenue Lift Station and the Ultraviolet (UV) Disinfection System. The community survey will be conducted September 15<sup>th</sup>, 16<sup>th</sup>, 22<sup>nd</sup>, 23<sup>rd</sup>, 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>.

Scott informed the Council that the work inside the Clinton Street Water Tower Painting Project is currently taking place.

Scott stated Industrial Park Road Resurfacing Project should be completed next week; until then the road is still closed.

Skare presented the Pufferbilly Days Committee's request for certain authorities within the right-of-way during the Pufferbilly Days Celebration including street closure maps and a resolution under the Consent Agenda. Skare advised there are some changes to the requirements for the alcohol license and Chief Wiebold is working with the Committee on this.

Mayor Slight asked if there were any questions or items to be removed from the Consent Agenda; no requests were made.

Piklapp moved; McGinn seconded to approve the following items on the Consent Agenda: 1) Minutes of previous meetings. 2) Bills payable. 3) Resolution 2637 granting the Pufferbilly Days Committee control and supervision over everything south of 12<sup>th</sup> Street during the annual celebration, subject to police powers and the laws of the State of Iowa. 4) Resolution 2638 approving the benefits and salary of Waylon Andrews for the Boone Public Works Department's Daily Operations Manager position at a base salary of \$70,000.00 per year beginning August 16, 2018. Ayes: Ray, Byrd, McGinn, Stines, Hicks and Piklapp. Nays: none.
